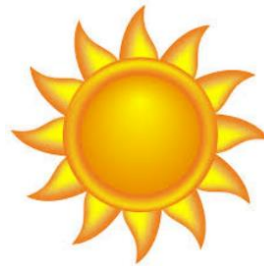

## Manifesto Guidelines

### How to write a Manifesto?

Your manifesto should state what you plan to do as the President of the Society and what changes you wish to make. This does not need to be a long document, but rather a short list of your main objectives for the year, as well as some background information about who you are and what makes you right for this position.

### Top tips for writing a manifesto:

- Try to be *concise* and *clear* with your language. Do not use *complicated* words.
- Add your goals you will achieve once elected.
- Focus on *yourself* and not on other candidates.
- Be *creative* and *original*.
- Set your previous *experience* out and how it relates that you are best for this position.
  
- Outline all the *relevant skills* you have that you think would appeal to voters for the role.

### What NOT to do when writing a manifesto:

- Explicit language
- Inappropriate/religious/political references
- Discriminatory language

**Note:** Get your manifesto checked by the Advisor. If there is any feedback on it by the Advisor, the candidate is expected to update the manifesto timely.
